Dear Parishioners,

We are coming to the end of the first year of our new preschool! How rewarding it has been to see the work of so many parishioners bear so much fruit. This has been a very successful endeavor, first and foremost as a ministry of evangelization. New families have joined our parish, children have been brought to the sacraments of the Church, and our parish life has become richer because of the involvement of preschool parents in the worship life and activities of our parish.

Financially speaking, the preschool has been not only self-supporting but it has helped the parish as a whole financially. Last year, we raised all of the funds needed to start-up the preschool. The generosity of our parishioners has continued. This year, in addition to tuition and fees that have more than covered operating costs, we received \$7,550 more in personal contributions to the preschool, in addition to \$2,850 that was given to begin our Grace Scholarship Fund for families in need of financial assistance. Our preschool will end this fiscal year very well, as we prepare to expand to a second classroom in the coming year.

There is no way to measure what the parish has received in the gifts that Mrs. Liz Lowrey has brought to us as our Preschool Director. We worked and prayed very hard, asking God to bring the right person to Mary Queen of Heaven. Liz has truly been a blessing and a joy. I want to thank her for all of her work and for every way that she shares herself and her faith with others, children and adults. I have invited Liz to share with you some of the preschool experiences of this first year. You will find below and on the following page what she and some of the parents want you to know.

Before I close, let me add a word of thanks, too, to all of those who have volunteered time and labor to improve our school building this year. My sincere thanks, too, to the members of the Finance Council and the Preschool Committee (which has now evolved into our first school board), who spent countless hours studying, praying, calculating, and planning for what has become a great gift to this parish. Thank you all from my heart.

What a year it has been! Thank you, Mary Queen of Heaven Parishioners and friends, for your vision, support, and dedication. We have been in school for 9 months and have grown together in various ways.

- Our faith and learning about The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit are not isolated to single teaching sessions. These are integrated in our daily work through our interactions with each other, our commitment to our families, and our daily routines. We begin our day by thanking God for the day, no matter what the weather is or our temperament, we always say thank you and ask God to help us be the best that we can be by loving our neighbors as ourselves. We pray for others and ask God to help them.
- Our supplies enhance and support our learning environment. Large hollow blocks, solid unit blocks, wooden vehicles, old blueprints, empty paper towel tubes, and legos to help our children create structures that include buildings, roads, diving boards, zoos, a cross for Jesus during Holy Week and wherever the children's imaginations and creativity take them. These experiences help develop our future construction teams, architects, designers, plumbers, firefighters, engineers and catechists!
- The dramatic play center has included new "appliances", food, babies, clothing, even a Christmas tree! This center supports our children's nurturing and communication skills through "playing" house, taking care of "the baby", setting tables, preparing for dinner, building movie theaters, as well as developing conflict resolution through sharing, taking turns, and negotiating. These skills help foster loving parents, chefs, organizers, social workers, and lawyers!

Preschool (Continued)

- Hands-on learning provides our children with the opportunity to become familiar with letters and literacy, numbers and math, imagination, resourcefulness, ingenuity, sensory integration and independence through personal interaction. Water, sand, soil, cutting, gluing, decision making, play dough, shaving cream, paper, crayons, markers, pencils, and various games that augment and support cognitive development, fine motor control, and self-esteem. These tools help our children develop a talent for writing, sculpting, gardening, accounting, and teaching. With these interests our children become interested in archaeology, physical therapy, doctors, artists, finance officers, and teachers!
- We have fourth grade prayer buddies. We thank God for our food each day and help collect food to share with others who do not have as much as we do. We learn about God's love for us by acting out the birth of Jesus and hearing stories about the miracles Jesus performed. We cried when we heard about Jesus dying and celebrated in the New Life of Easter! We are becoming contributing members of the larger community of our church. We witness our faith in action every day. These encounters help our children grow to be centered on our Catholic faith; offering opportunities for our children to be involved in ministry through singing at church, feeding the poor, helping one another, social justice, and feeling the love of God each day!

Just as our children are growing, so is our school enrollment! We serve children ages 3-4 in our 2-day, 3day, or 5-day program. Our hours are 8:45a.m. until 12:00 noon each day. We invite you to visit one of our Open Houses this summer (watch the bulletin for dates and times) or call 630-833-9500 to schedule a tour of our school. We are opening up a second classroom to meet the needs of our expanding enrollment for the 2008-2009 school year. We look forward to preparing a room and staff to welcome our children and their families. As our school grows, so does our parish. New families are joining and reaching out to our community at large. Look around you and see the new faces, feel the energy and new life. This is truly God at work through us! Let's continue to work together to strengthen and build on God's plan for us!
